

CSCA Hall of Fame

Purpose

To recognize and honor those CSCA members within two categories: those who have made significant contributions to Sporting Clays in California through their dedication and service to the sport, and those members who have shown exceptional shooting ability in NSCA registered events.

Qualifications for Nomination to the CSCA Hall of Fame

Jim Porter Service Award - Eligibility: any person who has been a member of the California Sporting Clays Association for at least five years and who has shown dedication to the promotion and betterment of the sport within the state of California. Some examples would be: the mentoring of new or young shooters, volunteer work to promote sporting clays in CA, or contributions as a range owner. A maximum of one member may receive the Jim Porter Service Award each year. The CSCA does not have to make this award if they do not feel they have qualified nominees.

California Shooter Hall of Fame Award – Eligibility: any person who has been a member of the California Sporting Clays Association for at least five years, has a history of exhibiting the highest standards of sportsmanship and who has accumulated a minimum of 1000 CSCA shooter points as shown below in Table 1. A maximum of two members may receive the California Shooter Hall of Fame Award each year. Eligibility does NOT imply automatic induction. Other criteria, such as sportsmanship, ethics, attitude, etc., will be considered by the nomination committee. The CSCA does not have to make this award if they do not feel they have qualified nominees.

The Hall of Fame Committee shall consist of at least two members of the CSCA board of directors; CSCA members from outside the board can also be appointed to the committee. The committee shall submit nominations (including the qualifications of the nominee) for induction into the HOF at least one month prior to the vote to give the board of director's time to review and discuss the nominations; the vote should be at least one month prior to the California State Sporting Clays Championship. The vote for the nominee must be made by the entire CSCA board of directors, the nominee may only receive one No vote from the full board membership; the balance of the votes must be YES in order to be inducted into the HOF.

When a person is inducted in to the HOF, they shall be recognized and awarded an HOF plaque at the California State Sporting Clays Championship held the year of the induction. A list of the HOF inductees will be kept on the CSCA website.
